### Honor Flight

Salvatore (Sal) Ingraldi, President, Honor Flight of Southern Colorado provided an overview of Honor Flight. The Honor Flight Network is a non-profit organization created to honor WWII Veterans for their sacrifices. They transport our heroes to Washington DC to visit and reflect at their memorials. The Organization is non-profit 501(c)(3). They have a trip scheduled in September and will be taking 25 veterans. The veteran will incur no expense and the cost is approximately \$950 per vet. Honor flight has a volunteer guardian for each vet to make sure they are taken care of and the guardians pay their own expenses. Honor Flight operates completely on donations and none of the volunteers are paid. Their goal is to take as many as possible on the 3-day trip. We are losing our WWII Veterans at 600 to 1,000 a day, so time is of the essence. They would like us to spread the word so that WWII veterans who do not know about the programs can sign up for the trip. **Insurance Representative** – Insurance Agent Joe Byrnes reported that there are some changes to the Long Term Care insurance products and New Term Insurance products. Also there is a new Young Adult Term Insurance product. Councils and members should contact their Field Agent for more details.

**State Officers Report**

State Advocate, Chris Foley provided more clarity of the recent Supreme Direction on Safe Environment Training for all Knights who work with Youth. All who work with Youth will have to take the Diocesan Training and send proof of training along with a Youth Leader request for background check (Form 4348) to Supreme. This is to be done by the end of July. If you are not able to meet the timeline, please do it as soon as possible. There is no cost for training or background checks. Diocesan Training is scheduled at the following locations: KofC Hall in Security, Aug 7, 6-8pm; St. Patrick’s, Aug 14, 6-8pm; Ave Maria in Parker, Aug 16, 10am-12pm; St. Gabriel, July 30, 7-9pm. Councils should check with their parishes to see what training they have scheduled. Once certified, it will be good for 3 years. Chris encouraged all GKs to log on to [www.kofc.org](http://www.kofc.org) and review the more detailed information that can be found in the “Desk Reference” section.

Chris also discussed the Trademark Protection direction from Supreme. There are three things that are considered the property of Supreme and cannot be used alone by the councils. It is OK to use them if the council name or number accompanies them. Trademark items are:

- KofC
- Knights of Columbus
- The KofC Emblem

Chris passed on comments from State Deputy, Chuck Page, who was attending a 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree. Chuck congratulates all new GK’s and all who are assuming new roles. PGK’s now have the responsibility to train and shepherd our new GK’s. Chuck asks that all councils participate in selling Football Frenzy tickets. It not only helps State Charities, but the councils receive \$2 for each ticket sold, receive a reduction in State Per Capita and expense relief for those attending the Convention. We should all promote our Goal of 1 member/per council/per month. It is our obligation to offer a lifetime opportunity for every practicing Catholic Man to join the KofC. To make our goal, we need to make sure our 1<sup>st</sup> Degrees are scheduled and prompt. Chuck requested that Councils support Special Olympics events and fill out the Special Olympics report form after each event. Supreme will give the State more money to support the Special Olympics if the forms are submitted. Chuck wanted to remind us that Councils need to be partners with their Parish. They should be supporting and integrating the activities with each other. There should be no competition.
