He conducts 2 masses each week, one at UCCS and one at Colorado University. A house was recently purchased and used as the Catholic Campus Ministry Center of Colorado Springs to provide a place for young people to socialize and develop their faith. Since the purchase, there has been a zoning issue to work through which has slowed down the progress. Our prayers are needed for a favorable resolution. The Silver Rose, symbol of Our Lady of Guadalupe and reminder of the Order's affirmation to defending human life, will soon be relayed from the Utah State Council to our young Columbian Squires here in Colorado for another successful trek through our great state on its pilgrimage to Mexico. This marks the fifth year that Colorado has had the opportunity to participate in the Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose – One Life, One Rose Program.

Between September 14th and October 12th, the Columbian Squires will spearhead this North American effort in Colorado which pays special tribute to Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. Through this program, six beautifully-crafted Silver Roses embark upon a journey of faith and devotion from Ontario, Canada, to Monterrey, Mexico. Whereas Knights of Columbus Councils and Assemblies lead the effort in other states across the United States, Colorado is unique in that our Columbian Squires are the ceremonial runners of the rose as it makes its way through our state, starting in Golden and ending in Pueblo, before moving on to New Mexico for the next leg of its journey.

The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. Since then, the program has continued as a collaborative effort on behalf of the Squires Circles, Knights of Columbus Councils, and Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Assemblies in several jurisdictions both here in the United States as well as in Canada and Mexico. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson expanded the program by initiating the "Running of the Rose" at the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Ontario. Under this new initiative, the Silver Rose travels from Canada through the United States to the city of Monterrey, Mexico, arriving at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12th, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

In earlier years, one rose was run from London, Ontario, through 10 states in the U.S. before crossing the International Bridge and ending its journey in Monterrey. Today, six roses make the trek simultaneously through 43 states and provinces before entering Mexico for the final leg of the pilgrimage to Monterrey.

"The 'Running of the Rose' is a perfect program from the Knights of Columbus," said Supreme Knight Anderson. "Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. Important Information to know for the 40 Days for Life prayer vigil:

- The fall (September 24-November 2) *40 Days for Life* effort is a 12 hour (6 a.m.-6 p.m.), 40 Day **peaceful**, prayer vigil in front of *Planned Parenthood* on 3480 Centennial Blvd.
- Under our 1st amendment rights, we have the right to be there. However, you should be aware the Colorado bubble law and know our limitations:

Revised CODE 5-3-10:

No person shall knowingly obstruct, detain, hinder, impede, or block another person's entry to or exit from a health care facility.

*No person shall knowingly approach another person within 8ft of such person, **unless such other person consents**, for the purpose of passing a leaflet or handbill to, displaying a sign to, or engaging in oral protest, education, or counseling with such other person in the public way or sidewalk area within a radius of 100ft from any entrance door to a healthcare facility.*

So...stay off *Planned Parenthood* property. You may park in the King Sooper's parking lot and then walk to Centennial Blvd. to pray. DO NOT go into the private driveways which lead into *Planned Parenthood*.

- If someone approaches you to talk, feel free to do so. Just say a quick prayer to the Holy Spirit for guidance on what to say. We also have literature you can pass out. Women and men who need help can be directed just a few blocks north on Centennial to:

- Post abortive women and men can also be directed to the pregnancy center for confidential counseling. *If you are unsure or have any questions about where to stand, email or call **Mike Mason** at: prolifefamilyof15@gmail.com 719-963-4095. The police have been informed of our peaceful presence. If anyone makes you feel nervous or threatened, do not hesitate to call 911.
- Many people spend their time there reading the Bible, praying the rosary, singing, or praying silently. Pray in whatever way the Holy Spirit leads you.
- Please leave any graphic or controversial signs at home. This is not a protest. We are there to pray and assist those who need help. Peaceful, loving signs are good.
- There is such a need for us to show the love of God by being there and praying. You never know when your very presence will affect someone going into the abortion clinic or those driving by. I thank you for your commitment to help the unborn and their mothers and fathers. God bless you all.
