

Guest Speaker: Fr William Kraus, OFM CAP



Father Bill Kraus, O.F.M. Cap., 72, was elected Provincial Vicar for the St. Conrad Province during the April 22-26, 2019 Province Chapter meeting in Victoria, Kan. Father Bill, formerly pastor of Our Lady of the Angels Parish in San Antonio, Texas, now serves as the Director of The Catholic Center at the Citadel Mall in Colorado Springs. He also served on the last Provincial Council and previously served as a Provincial Counselor in the 1980s. In his 48 years of priesthood, he has also ministered as a seminary teacher, novice master, local superior, homeless shelter director, inner-city pastor, vocation director and in prison ministry. From 1998-2009 he did mission work at Yecora, a remote mountainous region of northern Mexico, where he assisted friars from the Capuchin's Province of Western America both in evangelizing the local people and in helping form some as new Capuchin brothers. Born in Ransom, Kan., he holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy and master's degrees in theology and Franciscan studies.

Brothers, Our Liturgical year is coming to close, Nov 27, 2021. The Church will start the new Liturgical Year on Sunday, Nov 28, 2021. For this report, I thought I would share what is Advent.

What is Advent?

Sunday, November 28, 2021 - Friday, December 24, 2021

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of **preparation** that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

As we prepare for Christmas, the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* notes some differences to the Mass that should be observed during the season. For instance, the priest will wear violet or purple during Advent, except for the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) when rose is worn (GIRM, no. 316). Aside from what the priest wears, other aesthetic changes in the Church can include a more modestly decorated altar.

The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, we focus on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord at Christmas. In particular, the "O" Antiphons are sung during this period and have been by the Church since at least the eighth century. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming of Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but of present ones as well.

Advent devotions including the Advent wreath, remind us of the meaning of the season. Our Advent calendar above can help you fully enter into the season with daily activity and prayer suggestions to prepare you spiritually for the birth of Jesus Christ. More Advent resources are listed below.

Dear Brother Knights,

Chapter Meeting November 15 , 2021

The 2021 Knights of Columbus Coats for Kids Distribution for Colorado Springs was conducted on Saturday, September 25 at the Family Life Services Center (Helen Hunt Campus) of Catholic Charities of Central Colorado, from 9AM to noon.

550 new coats were available for distribution. The breakdown was 40 cases of coats (40 dozen = 480) purchased from Knights Gear, along with an additional 30 new coats (estimated) that were provided from council coat drives and purchases. An additional 40 (est.) additional pre-owned coats were also donated. These were available should the clients desire that particular size or style.

Eleven (11) Knights and family members participated in the sorting effort on Friday, September 24. Another 11 (many the same, but some changes) participated in the distribution on Saturday, Sept 25. 228 coats were distributed on Saturday Sept 25. A list of about 40 clients were documented where we did not have the appropriate size coat available. Catholic Charities will follow up with these clients as additional coats arrive.

The remaining coats (approx. 222) are being re-sorted and stored by Catholic Charities for another distribution in early November. Any coats remaining when spring arrives, will be inventoried and stored for the 2022 Coats for Kids distribution.

Thank you Brother Knights for your generosity and support in helping make the 2021 Coats for Kids a success. Unfortunately, the match from Supreme had more specific requirements than we had been told, and was geared toward a November 26 (Black Friday) distribution. The "match" was actually a 50% discount when the orders were placed, and were required to be placed by Colorado State only. This is very disappointing and none of the purchases we did for the Catholic Charities distribution were eligible for the match.
